

2020 AAAPC Fellowship

The Travelling Fellowship has been reviewed in 2020 in light of the global pandemic which is restricting travel. We have also revised the Fellowship to take account of the increasing financial constraints that are being experienced by our members. The Fellowship will be reviewed annually to ensure it is best meeting the needs of our AAAPC members.

The following are guidelines applicable to the AAAPC Travelling Fellowship 2020 only.

Aims:

- Assist members of AAAPC to undertake academic activities including costs associated with carrying out research, dissemination, professional development and impact.
- Provide support particularly, but not exclusively for, those who are early career researchers.
- Enhance Australasian academic primary care in a community setting.
- Foster collaboration between Australasian and international primary care researchers.
- Support First Nations' primary care academics across Australasia.

Purpose

The Travelling Fellowship is available for any activity that meets aims of the program.

Examples of activities:

- initiate or continue a research or teaching project;
- undertake a mutually beneficial critical appraisal of the host department's teaching and research programs either in-person or virtually;
- deliver a teaching or research program in collaboration with the host department either in-person or virtually;
- activities or resources to support research and/or teaching that are not available through your institution;
- dissemination and impact activities related to your research and/or teaching, for example conference presentations.

Value and criteria for use of grant

Applications are welcome for amounts up to \$1000. Fellowships must be used in the year specified in the application process. A total fellowship pool of \$3000 is available.

One fellowship of up to \$1000 will be allocated to a First Nations applicant (eligible application dependent).

The funds can contribute to travel costs and accommodation, plus other items such as professional development, dissemination costs, direct research costs and conference registration. The funding is not intended to cover costs for meals and other incidentals.

Travelling Fellowships will be offered in years where the Executive deem that sufficient funds are available.

The assistance is particularly but not exclusively for those who are early career researchers.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be a current financial member of AAAPC & have held membership for at least one year before applying; First Nations members do not have a time limit on their membership

- for eligibility;
- be actively involved in primary care research or teaching;
- not have held an AAAPC Travelling Fellowship in the previous four years.

Submission of Applications

Applications must be in minimum font size 11 point. PDF versions (in one document) should be submitted electronically to the AAAPC Secretary by 4 November 2020. **Late applications will not be accepted.**

Your application must include:

- Contact details, please include if you are a First Nations' academic
- Letter of support from head of your institution/department confirming that the financial support is NOT available from your home institution
- Plain language summary of proposed use of funding including aims & objectives and how it will contribute and further your primary care research career (100-300 words)
- Outline of activities - include how your proposed activities clearly link to the aims of your fellowship (2 A4 pages maximum, table format is preferred)
- Budget
- Outcome (max 300 words) - explain how your proposed Fellowship will benefit yourself, your institution and the wider AAAPC community
- Curriculum Vitae - no more than two pages

Assessment process

Eligibility check – the application will be reviewed for eligibility including the financial membership status of the applicant.

Peer Review - applications will be reviewed by three members of the AAAPC Executive Committee based on the aims of the Fellowship Program, in particular:

- a) relevance to the goals and values of the Australasian Association for Academic Primary Care;
- b) track record of the applicant relative to opportunity;
- c) commitment to academic primary care;
- d) likelihood that the fellowship will be of value to the applicant's career in academic primary care.

Offers

The Secretary will inform the Applicants, in writing, of the outcome of the review process within 6 weeks of the close of application.

Payment to recipient

The fellowship will be paid to the recipient as a reimbursement. Any financial difficulties with upfront payment will be taken on a case by case basis by the President. To receive the funds the recipient must provide:

- Tax invoices for the agreed expenses as per the application AND
- A final written report to the AAAPC Executive outlining the outcomes of the fellowship, with permission this will be published on the AAAPC website AND
- A short summary for advertising the fellowship for the following year.
