## **AAAPC Executive and Subcommittee Updates**

**Executive committee updates:** The AAAPC remains in the green and is continuing to reinvest available funds into organisational and member benefits. Member awards are currently being considered (hardship award, travelling fellowship) for payment out over the coming months. Income is expected to rise in March with renewal of memberships, this will be used to support conference organisation, ongoing organisation administration (website, insurance etc) and member awards. The executive committee will raise the topic of a membership fee increase for members to vote at the Annual General Meeting 2024 as membership has remained stagnant for 5 years. The executive committee will meet again in March 2024.



AAAPC has 5 subcommittees dedicated to advancing the <u>AAAPC strategic plan</u> and building excellence in academic primary care.

## Subcommittee updates

Academic Policy & Advocacy: Has analysed a survey of active members and is making a plan to address member interests and concerns over the next 12 months. The focuses include advocacy for Primary Care funding and transparency of funding; the workforce crisis for all primary care professionals and the primary care scope of practice review; follow up on the 10yr primary care plan and Strengthening Medicare report; as well as building relationships with local and federal policy influencers. The subcommittee will meet in the next month to discuss strategies moving forward.

**Membership Engagement**: Has analysed our last membership survey and presented findings to executive committee and is working on a plan to ensure value for members through regular webinars and workshops. The subcommittee continues to produce media and marketing materials for the organisation with an increasing focus on the 2024 conference – keep an eye on our twitter and LinkedIn page to get all the latest news and updates!

**Conference**: Has been busy with registrations and the abstract portal now open! The subcommittee has secured the venue, catering, and a few keynote speakers (to be announced soon!). The conference subcommittee will be on a sponsorship drive for the next month seeking funding from like-minded organisations to support a fantastic conference experience. This subcommittee will meet in Mid February to keep the momentum rolling, and even start discussing AAAPC2025!

**Education**: Has finished a draft discussion paper on Multidisciplinary team care in general practice and will work with the APA subcommittee on the potential development of a AAAPC position statement. The discussion paper will be shared widely with members once finalised via publication and/or AAAPC position statement. This subcommittee is also planning a webinar for members in June 2024 – watch this space for details!

**Early Career Academics**: Has matched the mentors and mentees for the Early Career and will lead two introductory sessions in the next couple of months for mentors and mentees. The subcommittee has drafted ethics application for program evaluation for submission through one academic institution. The subcommittee is also hosting a webinar in February by Associate Professor Ayton on consumer engagement and co-design.

#### **Upcoming Primary Care Opportunities**

#### International research funding opportunities

The **NIHR Health Technology Assessment Programme** in the UK has a long-standing collaboration with the Australian NHMRC and advertise joint commissioned calls inviting collaborative international research proposals to address shared research priorities. These collaborative commissioned calls are announced on

the <u>NIHR</u> and funding <u>NHMRC</u> websites. There is also opportunity to <u>suggest research</u> <u>topics</u> that could go through the NIHR prioritisation process for future funding consideration. Joint funding applications between the UK and Australia may be one way to provide opportunity and solidify international relationships in primary health care research. Please contact the Secretariat if you have a research idea and we can put you in touch with the Society for Academic Primary Care (SAPC) in the UK who may be able to assist with facilitating collaboration with NIHR.

The **NHMRC-EU Collaborative Research Grant Scheme** supports Australian participation in international collaborative research under Horizon Europe. Several topics streams are available, with primary care applications for all streams. Find out more about how to apply <u>here</u>, via GrantConnect.

#### Australian primary care specific funding opportunities

To build knowledge of the factors that contribute to mental illness in children and keep children mentally healthy or to develop assessments, treatments, preventions or improve understanding of therapeutics for childhood mental illness and psychological distress. Due 27 March, 2024.
- MRFF EPCDRI & PHCRI 2023 Multidisciplinary Models of Primary Care Grant Opportunity, stream 1. To support a competitively selected primary care led national consortium that will focus on ways to think about primary care delivery through multidisciplinary team-based care. - MRFF EPCDRI &PHCRI 2023 Multidisciplinary Models of Primary Care Grant Opportunity, stream 2. To prospectively evaluate patient registration and how effective it is in different settings. Applications or urban or a regional, rural and remote will be considered separately. Due 10 April, 2024.
- MRFF EPCDRI &PHCRI 2023 Multidisciplinary Models of Primary Care Grant Opportunity, stream 3. TO develop and implement collaborative consortia that uses existing data assets to inform value-based care, promote information sharing, empower patients, and drive insights for planning resourcing and continuous QI. Due 10 April, 2024
- MRFF EPCDRI &PHCRI 2023 Multidisciplinary Models of Primary Care Grant Opportunity streams 4. To develop and implement multidisciplinary collaborative, regional consortia that design, implement and evaluate system level reform strategies for local integration. Applications or urban or a regional, rural and remote will be considered separately. Due 7 August, 2024.
- NHMRC-European Union Collaborative Research Grant 2024. To facilitate collaboration and strengthen research impact and innovation for global health challenges. Potential primary care applications for streams in personalised prevention of non-communicable diseases; comparative effectiveness for healthcare interventions; and pandemic preparedness and response (adaptive platform trials for pandemic preparedness). Due 16 October, 2024.
